What is Rainbow Story time?

Rainbow story time is a family friendly event aimed at younger children incorporating book reading, singing and dancing. The event is focussed on acceptance, anti-bullying, inclusion, being kind and having confidence in yourself. It will be full of colour, sparkle, flamboyance and fun, with children encouraged to come dressed up for the occasion. Erika and Coco Flash are the storytellers who will host the event.

Who are the storytellers and what are their backgrounds?

Erika and Coco Flash are professional drag queen entertainers who have been reading at Libraries since 2019. They have many years' experience and qualifications in educating and entertaining younger children, teens and adults. Both are police vetted and certified to work with children and young people.

What books will they be reading?

The books will be selected from a range of published titles that are already in the Rotorua Library children's collection. The children's collection is managed under the Library Collections Policy, which complies with the Films, Videos and Publications Act 1993, Copyright Act 1993 and is guided by the International Federation of Library Associations and Institutions Statues.

When is Rainbow Story time and who can attend?

Rainbow Story Time is scheduled for Thursday 21 March 2024 at 10.30am in the Community Pride Space on the ground floor.

While the event is targeted at pre-schoolers and their caregivers, any member of the public is welcome to attend. Like many events registration is required to ensure those attending have an enjoyable and safe experience. The Community Pride Space is part of the open plan nature of the ground floor. This means people in other spaces may hear the event. Users can choose to either head to a quieter space within the Library or come back at another time.
